MAYOR-Deb Krisicki-Thanked everyone for great response to the "Adopt a Street Sign" and the project is moving forward. Contacted police with regard to large trucks using Carter Drive to turn onto state route for Turnpike, J. J. Mullin from Pikes Creek the contractor has been made aware and will address the issue of repaving when the equipment is brought to do the Turnpike. Attended meeting of the Planning Commission along with other interested citizens and felt that the meeting was conducted properly and on a good note. The only objection the Mayor had was the inappropriate comments made after the meeting had concluded. She hopes that the general public will conduct themselves in a respectful manner and leave personal feelings at the door. President Rogan then noted that from now on the Planning Commission has been instructed to lock the building and if anyone wishes to stay they will have to unlock and let themselves back in the building.

LAKE MANAGEMENT/RECREATION Shaun Kuter – Ecological Services is the lowest bidder for spraying of the lily pads at a cost of \$500.00. They will also address bladder wort is necessary.
