LAKE MANAGEMENT/RECREATION Shaun Kuter – Testing of Beaches will begin shortly and last thru the summer.

ROADS-Vince Kimsal- has been in contact with Nick Argot regarding the pothole patching of Borough roads and fixing of the shoulders on Hollenback, at this point Nick believes the project will be under the \$19,500 so phone bids may be solicited.

A **Motion** was made by Rogan and 2nd by Kuter to have Vince Kimsal pursue the bid package for the road repairs from Nick Argot of Borton Lawson and fix potholes and do shoulder work. Roll call: Rogan, aye, Kuter, aye, Kimsal, aye, Campbell, aye, Marth, aye, all ayes, motion carried.

DAM – Paul Rogan – DEP cancelled a scheduled meeting for next week with regard to the Dam. **SEWER: Paul Rogan** – nothing to report.

RTK: Rich Campbell – nothing to report.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Discussion was held on the geese problem and the best way to handle the ongoing problem of residents feeding the geese. It was decided not to pursue an ordinance at this time. Signs will be posted with the dangers to the lake and surrounding shoreline that come with the large population of geese.

A Motion was made by Rogan and 2nd by Kuter to pass **Resolution #20 of 2016** to have Teresa Wojchiechowsi, Treasurer allowing her the authority to represent, sign and handle the opening of a DAM Account on behalf of Penn Lake Park Council with PLIGIT.

The Borough Secretary then reported that she had looked into the signs for Lakeview Drive denoting the street number directions. After a discussion as to color and size requirements it was decided to purchase house number signs to aid any and all emergency responders. The cost of each sign is estimated to be \$66.00.

A Motion was made by Kimsal and 2nd by Campbell to purchase the signs.

NEW BUSINESS:

Three bids were received and reviewed by Council with regard to the cutting of ballpark, dam and other maintenance.

1. Paragon Home Maintenance \$5,250.00

2. MowJo \$1,750.00 \$30.00/hour cleaning debris along roads

3. Eternal Gardening \$4,886.60

Discussion ensued on the bids and it was decided to hire for 2016 MowJo providing the Borough receives the proper insurance requirements.

A **Motion** was made by Rogan and 2nd by Kuter to hire MowJo for 2016 season to do the seasonal maintenance work and grass cutting to be overseen by Vince Kimsal, providing MowJo provides proper insurance.

PUBLIC COMMENT:
