ROADS-Vince Kimsal- no report. The tree trimmers should be here this month.

DAM – **Paul Rogan**-GOE completed the necessary work at the Dam this past Tuesday May 9th I am waiting on the formal report before commenting any further.

SEWER: Paul Rogan—Bad month for Borough. We had four (4) pumps go costs will be reflected in next month TR report. In another matter, it was explained that there was a problem with a grinder pump constantly running. Aqua was called and acts as the agent for the Borough. Aqua contacts and hires all the subcontractors that perform said work on the sewer lines and/or pumps. Aqua contacted at least two (2) contractors the first to respond was hired by Aqua and proceeded with the work. The original problem turned out to be a grommet on the pump. This is a complex situation. There was a lot of excavation and finally the problem was determined. A **Motion** was made by Rogan and 2nd by Campbell to ask the homeowner to split the excavation costs with the Borough after the homeowner produces a paid invoice of \$1,865.00 (\$932.50). Rogan will propose to homeowner.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

President Rogan again addressed the issue of the survey of the ballpark. He has been trying to determine the exact amount of land cross hatched on the conveyance from Carolyn Basler to the Borough years ago. This is still being worked on since no metes and bounds were ever spelled out. He has been in contact with the Basler's.

The PennVest loan was discussed again, Rogan was told that once a year we could make a payment on principle, with an email alerting them first. We can payoff at any time. When we asked them about our excess amount their response was that our balance is not excessive in view of the failures that could happen.

MOJO was the only bidder with regard to grass cutting. Since he was the only bidder it was decided to rehire him for 2017.

A **Motion** was made by Rogan and 2nd by Kuter to hire MOJO for the spring and summer season of 2017 at the prices stated in his proposal.

A **Motion** was made by Rogan and 2nd by Kuter to pass **Resolution # 5, 2017** to pay White Haven for fire protection for the year 2017 at a cost of \$3,300.00 and Workmen's Compensation of \$1,593.00.
