RESOLUTION NO.6, 2017 PENN LAKE PARK BOROUGH LUZERNE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

WHEREAS, Penn Lake Park Borough Council wants to support the Penn Lake Association's efforts in providing safe, clean bathing areas; and

WHEREAS, Penn Lake Park Borough Council recognizes that elevated fecal coliform counts due to excessive goose populations can cause health issues of the gastrointestinal tract, skin, ears, eyes, genitourinary, and nervous system; and

WHEREAS, Penn Lake Park Borough has actively requested that residents stop feeding geese, with limited success.

WHEREAS, Penn Lake Park Borough Council understands that during the current summer of 2017, high fecal coliform counts have caused rashes on children and pets, people to be sickened, and a 2 week beach closing; and

WHEREAS, Penn Lake Park Borough Council believes that feeding waterfowl upsets the ecosystem and can lead to property damage and health hazards; and

WHEREAS, Penn Lake Park Borough Council believes that non-lethal goose abatement measures may not be sufficient to correct the health hazard caused by geese at Penn Lake; now, be it

THEREFORE resolved, this 10th day of August, 2017 that the following be adopted:

- 1. Penn Lake Park Council will write, enact, and enforce a "No Wildfowl Feeding" ordinance with deliberate haste.
- 2. Penn Lake Park Council will pursue practical non-lethal goose abatement measures that *may* include habitat modification, fencing, pyrotechnics, dogs, hunting, egg addling, and contraception.
- 3. Penn Lake Park Council will explore and pursue if practical, any and all capture and euthanasia methods consistent with state and federal regulations.
